FROM THE WESTMINSTER PULPIT

The 500th anniversary of the beginning of the Protestant Reformation is this month! In a 5-week sermon series, we’ll learn about the five mottoes or solas (in Latin) that capture the core of Reformed theology.

- Oct. 8 Sola Scriptura (“Scripture alone”):
The Bible alone is our highest authority.
- Oct. 15 Solus Christus (“Christ alone”):
Jesus Christ alone is our Lord, Savior, and King.
- Oct. 22 Sola Gratia (“grace alone”):
We are saved by the grace of God alone.
- Oct. 29 Sola Fide (“faith alone”):
We are saved through faith alone in Jesus Christ.
- Today Soli Deo Gloria (“to the glory of God alone”):
We live for the glory of God alone.
