Today We Celebrate the Lord's Supper

All who profess faith in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior are invited to share in the bread and the cup. Your pastors will offer prayer and liturgy from the church sanctuary, and you are invited to partake at home. There is no "official" way to have communion during a livestream service, but we'll all do the best we can and trust in the Holy Spirit to do his thing. Children are invited to the table provided they've had instruction at home or in Westminster's worship prep class (1st grade). To prepare, get together bread (or crackers), juice (or wine), and have it set out at the beginning of the service.

The author of this Trinitarian text is unknown, but this hymn has proved popular since the middle of the 18th century, partly because of its effective use of biblical metaphors, but also because of the strength of this tune, which was composed especially for these words.

This text affirms that Christian unity is not achievement but gift, one renewed each time we gather for the Lord's Supper. Each of us enters as an "I" and leaves as part of "we." The unadorned language of this text is well matched to the simple shape note tune that sets it here.
