
ASH WEDNESDAY Wednesday, February 17

Ash Wednesday is the beginning of Lent. It's called Ash Wednesday because as a sign of repentance, believers through the centuries have received the mark of an ashen cross on their forehead. The ashes remind us of God's words to Adam when he sinned-"remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return," and it reminds us of the Old Testament practice of wearing sackcloth and having ashes placed on the head as a sign of spiritual poverty. Because of Covid protocols, we will not be able to offer ashes, but we are gathering for worship and The Lord's Supper on February 17 @ 6:00 p.m. in the sanctuary. Following worship, we'll have the opportunity to participate in the Backpack Buddies ministry. All ages welcomed; the service will be livestreamed for those unable to attend in-person.

In January, we added our afterschool programs with Covid protocols which include Yoga, Dance, and Eat & Explore. The parents were so excited that the children could participate in these programs.

In January, we opened Registration to our current families and church families and on February 1st to the public. We are pleased to have continued interest in attending the school but would like to see more families enroll. We give tours after school hours and on weekends. It is our hope that the enrollment will increase for next year. We have also advertised with Lowcountry Parent Magazine and their online school fair through all Post and Courier publications.

For that reason, we are asking our members not to bring any more winter coats or jackets to the church. The schools have been told that if a need arises they will call us and let us know so we can get the word out.

Thank you to all who made this project so successful. We gave approximately 300 adult coats to TriCounty during their winter coat distribution. We gave six or seven dozen elementary size coats to Chicora, and maybe three to four dozen of the wee sizes to Mary Ford. Everyone was thrilled with our efforts. Believe me they were much needed and will help protect families through the winter.

HANDS OF CHRIST Volunteer Opportunity

At the end of 2020, Hands of Christ restarted an Emergency Clothing Distribution for Charleston County School. After purchasing varying sizes that were running low, we were able to handle up to 1000 more children for the remainder of the school year. The Emergency Distribution ending in December resulted in 822 children getting full school uniforms from 29 schools.

SABBATICAL UPDATE

"Then God blessed the seventh day and made it holy, because on it he rested from all the work of creating that he had done." -Genesis 2:3

Sabbatical is a word whose roots are in the creation story: God took a Sabbath rest after six days of creation. In the church today it refers to a time for pastors, usually in the seventh year of a call, to take a break from the unique stresses and time demands of ministry. More than an extended vacation, it is a time of intentional renewal and created space so God can replenish the soul. It's designed so pastors can stay healthy, remain faithful, and stay longer. The Charleston Atlantic Presbytery mandates such pastoral renewal. When Westminster called Pastor Daniel to serve as our pastor in 2015, the congregation voted unanimously to include this stipulation: "In the seventh year of service, the congregation will provide for a three month Clergy Renewal Leave, continuing the salary and benefits for that period, and providing for pulpit supply in the pastor's absence." Pastor Daniel will begin his seventh year with us in June 2021 and will take his Clergy Renewal Leave from July 1st through September 30th.

Last March in anticipation of Pastor Daniel's sabbatical, Daniel along with the Session applied for a Lilly Foundation Clergy Renewal Grant, intended to be used to support renewal activities for both the congregation and pastor. A detailed report of both Pastor Daniel's clergy renewal plans and the plans for pulpit and staff supply were submitted. Unfortunately, the Lilly Foundation notified us in October that Westminster did not receive the grant.

At the October Session meeting, the Session agreed that the plans that had been laid out for the Clergy Renewal Leave should go forward. An ad hoc committee has been established to examine and resolve the financial obligations, the pulpit supply and the staffing needs to support and renew the congregation as well as Pastor Daniel during the sabbatical period. Westminster values the minsters who serve us with their time, leadership, pastoral care, teaching and spiritual guidance. Now we are called to care for Pastor Daniel by seeing that his needs for spiritual and personal renewal are met as we honor the commitment we made to him at his call in 2015. In the weeks and months ahead of the sabbatical look for further exciting details regarding the renewal plan for Westminster and Pastor Daniel.

WESTMINSTER FINANCIAL UPDATE FOR 2020 AND 2021

The year 2020 ended with so many changes this past year that it is hard to recall a normal year and yet we have a ways to go in 2021 to approach a more normal time.

Our financial situation in 2020 turned out to be a pleasant surprise. Our giving exceeded our expenses by approximately \$14,000. The positive result in 2020 is through prayer and the generous giving of the congregation and friends of Westminster.

We were also able to complete our ADA bathroom, repaint the hallway in the Administrative wing, provide needed maintenance and repairs to our stained glass windows, and make some paving repairs.

The other good news is that we exceeded the budget in the area of Benevolences and Missions by approximately \$17,000. I am sure you agree that if we are going to exceed the budget, the area of Benevolences and Missions is the right place to be generous. Above and beyond that good news, we continue to support the food pantry, the Blessing Box, backpack buddies and other special missions.

By all measures, 2020 was a successful year for Westminster. Now is the time to look to the financial needs for Westminster in 2021. Challenges do face us in 2021. Our Stewardship Program this past fall focused on Jeremiah 29:11: "For I know the plans I have for you, declared the Lord, plans to prosper you and not harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."

The 2021 Stewardship Campaign resulted in \$600,000 in pledges; however that is \$40,000 less than in 2020. Given the severe economic consequences of the Pandemic, this was completely understandable. The Session also adjusted the anticipated unpledged giving for 2021 by \$15,000.

We were able to hold our budgeted expenses similar to last year to continue to provide full support for all our Missions and Programs at Westminster. However there were two notable increases: the establishment of a Pastor Development line item in support of our Pastors and an increase in our insurance premium.

With the reduction in income and the increase in expenses the Session approved a 2021 budget with a Budget Contingency (the projected shortfall between income and expenses) of \$112,611. How was the Session able to do this? The Session has Faith that the Congregation will respond with their continued generous giving and the Session will be diligent in looking for ways to reduce spending.

Also, this was possible because of the generous giving of the Congregation in the past. We have gone the past three years with fully meeting or exceeding our budgeted giving and reducing our expenses. These extra dollars have been accumulated in the Session Discretionary Fund and available in times of need.

What can you do? I think back to Pastor Daniel's sermon in early August on 1 Thessalonians Chapter 5 verses 16-18: "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, and give thanks in all circumstances to God the Father in the name of his son Christ Jesus, for this is his will for you."

May Westminster rejoice in the good financial situation of 2020, be in prayer for 2021 and give thanks for God's will to be done in our Congregation.
