

PASTOR GREETING

In his book, "Diffusion of Innovations" (1962), sociologist Everett Rogers describes 5 personality types when it comes to a willingness to try new products and adopt new ideas.



INNOVATION ADOPTION LIFECYCLE

- <u>Innovators</u> are the first in line to try a new thing. It is partly because they are, by nature, risk takers and excited about new ideas and ways of doing things.
- <u>Early Adopters</u> are ready to try new things, but they are very thoughtful and tend to make reasoned decisions.
- <u>Early Majority</u> is a group who are reasonably risk averse and want to make sure their money is wisely invested in the new products they try.
- <u>Late Majority</u> is a group that are often skeptical about new ideas and prefer to stick with the things that have proven to be tried and true.
- <u>Laggards</u> (Everett's term) is the final group who are highly resistant to change and risk; they may eventually try the new thing, but only after the trend is over.

As we come out from the shadow of Covid, I expect there will be similar responses as vaccinations continue, things start opening up, and life returns to some semblance of normal. I feel it in my own psyche when I see crowds of people together: Is it OK for them to be doing that?

I suggest as we go forward, we use the same level of patience and understanding with each other as we have tried to have in the last year. Some are ready to tear off the mask and hug and kiss with reckless abandon (Innovators). Others may still be traumatized by the grief of losing a loved one or afraid to rebound too quickly (Laggards or Late Majority). Their responses are partly conditioned by their personality, and a range of responses among a variety of people should be expected. Maybe more than ever, now is the time to proceed with love, considering the needs of others. As Philippians admonishes us:

Complete my joy by being of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind. Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves. Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others. (Philippians 2:2-4)

FROM THE PULPIT Return, Rebuild, Renew

On April 25, we'll begin a new sermon series on the book of Nehemiah -Nehemiah's Life after Exile. The Israelites had experienced a terrible time: the destruction of Jerusalem and the sacred temple, deportation to Babylon, and life as exiles among their enemies. But now they were permitted to come back to the ruins of their sacred city. It is time to Return, Rebuild, and Renew, learning about a new life prepared for them by God. Nehemiah is a book about life and rebuilding after exile: perfect for us as we climb back from the Covid pandemic.

VOLUNTEER WITH Reading Partners South Carolina

Westminster is serving as a tutoring center for Reading Partners South Carolina. Westminster currently hosts 20 tutoring sessions and there is a need to serve more children from the Charleston County School District. Reading Partners is looking to host up to 30 more tutoring sessions from Westminster. Those interested in tutoring must attend two virtual orientations before being connected with an elementary school student and beginning a literacy mentorship. Tutoring sessions last just over an hour and volunteers must commit to at least one session per week, M-Th during the hours of 9am-3pm. No teaching or tutoring experience is required to participate in this program and onsite support is available. All tutoring centers follow CDC COVID-19 health and safety guidelines.

HANDS OF CHRIST STATUS & NEEDS

So far we've distributed 153 bags of emergency clothing since January 1 for a total of 1035 children receiving school clothing, supplies, and books this school year. We expect to continue distributing emergency clothing to Charleston County Schools until the end of the school year.

- Books for Children Pre K thru 8th grade reading levels.
- We are completely out of books for 4th thru 8th grade. These are the grades students start reading chapter books.

PLAYGROUND OPPORTUNITY

The time has come to retire some of the old playground equipment and replace it with something new. What we have has served us well (for 20 years), and we know the equipment will be a great addition! We've budgeted \$36,000 for the project, but we only need to raise \$9,000!! That's because the Westminster Endowment will give \$3 for every \$1 donated. That means if you give \$100, the Endowment will kick in \$300, turning your gift into \$400.

SESSION MEETING HIGHTLIGHTS: MARCH 21, 2021

The meeting was called to order on ZOOM at 6 pm with prayer by Pastor Daniel Smoak who moderated the meeting and presented the devotional.

Administration – We have initiated a change in custodial services which will occur April 12.

Finance – approve the February 2021 Budget Summary. Contributions are ahead of budget YTD. Cash flow is positive YTD. Approved funding for new playground equipment. The WPC Endowment will give \$3 for every \$1 donated- up to \$27,000 for a total budget of \$36,000. Preschool Committee will make plans for equipment and installation.

Rebounding from COVID-19: Added these changes to current Covid Policy: Replacing hymnals and Bibles in the pews; Singing in worship (with masks on); Worship leaders removing masks for the parts they are leading; Return to usual Youth Group Format: Jr. High would meet from 5-6 pm and Sr. High from 6-7 pm with a snack/meal in between; Allow meetings in classrooms for groups 10 or fewer. Expected next steps will be resuming 8:45 worship service and resuming Nursery Care and Children's Church for 11:00 worship.

Adopted recommendation from the Mission Committee (and guest Dee Bee Wright) to support the BetterNorthBridge Coalition alongside our partners LowCountry Food Bank and Metanoia in alignment with our church's mission to care and promote equity within our community beyond our walls. We will write a letter on behalf of the church supporting this project, encourage the congregation to write letters of support, and offer sign space on our property to encourage others to do the same.

Before adjournment, we shared pastoral concerns and sang "God is so Good."
