PASTOR GREETING

For the last few months you've been hearing us talk and preach about Praying the Psalms. The sermon series is on the psalms, and our Lenten devotions are designed to help you pray the psalms.

Along the way, you've heard us say things like "The psalms are the school of prayer where we learn how to pray" and "There is a psalm for every occasion: a model prayer for everything life brings our way." Simply put, God has given us the psalms to teach us how to pray in the highs and lows of life. God wants us to stay connected to him in prayer, and the psalms are a means to that end.

But there is something more. When Paul teaches us about prayer in the New Testament, he alludes to the psalms. In Romans 8, he begins by explaining why we need to pray at all:

For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory that is to be revealed to us. For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the sons of God. For the creation was subjected to futility, not willingly, but because of him who subjected it, in hope that the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to corruption and obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God. For we know that the whole creation has been groaning together in the pains of childbirth until now. And not only the creation, but we ourselves.... (Romans 8:18-23)

After painting the picture of the brokenness of the world, he moves to the help we have from God. The Spirit of God helps us in prayer, interceding for us according to the will of God.

Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness. For we do not know what to pray for as we ought, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with groanings too deep for words. And he who searches hearts knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God.

I think there are two ways to think about the help

we receive from the Spirit. First, in the same way Jesus prayed for his disciples (and for us) in John 17, the Holy Spirit of the living Christ prays for us today. I find it encouraging and comforting to know the Spirit is my prayer partner!

A second way the Spirit helps us in prayer is by giving us the words to pray. Romans 8:27 says the Spirit prays for us according to the will of God, meaning the prayers of the Spirit are the prayers we should also pray if we want to pray according to God's will. And, if we understand the psalms as inspired (in-Spirited) words, then when we pray the psalms, we are praying in the Spirit, according to the will of God. God has given us these Spiritfilled prayers to help us know how to pray. When we pray the psalms, we are joining our voices and our hearts with the work of the Spirit, who is already praying on our behalf. It means prayer is not so much what we are doing all by ourselves, it is instead our joining in, with the help of the Spirit, something that God is already doing.

So, friends, take heart! Pray in the Spirit! Pray the psalms!

VOLUNTEER WITH READING PARTNERS SOUTH CAROLINA

Westminster is serving as a tutoring center for Reading Partners South Carolina. Westminster currently hosts 20 tutoring sessions and there is a need to serve more children from the Charleston County School District. Reading Partners is looking to host up to 30 more tutoring sessions from Westminster. Those interested in tutoring must attend two virtual orientations before being connected with an elementary school student and beginning a literacy mentorship. Tutoring sessions last just over an hour and volunteers must commit to at least one session per week, M-Th during the hours of 9am-3pm. No teaching or tutoring experience is required to participate in this program and onsite support is available. All tutoring centers follow CDC COVID-19 health and safety guidelines.

They ask for prayer for an upcoming revival and ministries to men who battle the effects of alcohol and drugs.

WESTMINSTER FINANCIAL UPDATE FOR 2020 AND 2021

The year 2020 ended with so many changes this past year that it is hard to recall a normal year and yet we have a ways to go in 2021 to approach a more normal time.

Our financial situation in 2020 turned out to be a pleasant surprise. Our giving exceeded our expenses by approximately \$14,000. The positive result in 2020 is through prayer and the generous giving of the congregation and friends of Westminster.

We were also able to complete our ADA bathroom, repaint the hallway in the Administrative wing, provide needed maintenance and repairs to our stained glass windows, and make some paving repairs.

The other good news is that we exceeded the budget in the area of Benevolences and Missions by approximately \$17,000. I am sure you agree that if we are going to exceed the budget, the area of Benevolences and Missions is the right place to be generous. Above and beyond that good news, we continue to support the food pantry, the Blessing Box, backpack buddies and other special missions.

By all measures, 2020 was a successful year for Westminster. Now is the time to look to the financial needs for Westminster in 2021. Challenges do face us in 2021. Our Stewardship Program this past fall focused on Jeremiah 29:11: "For I know the plans I have for you, declared the Lord, plans to prosper you and not harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."

The 2021 Stewardship Campaign resulted in \$600,000 in pledges; however that is \$40,000 less than in 2020. Given the severe economic consequences of the Pandemic, this was completely understandable. The Session also adjusted the anticipated unpledged giving for 2021 by \$15,000.

We were able to hold our budgeted expenses similar to last year to continue to provide full support for all our Missions and Programs at Westminster. However there were two notable increases: the establishment of a Pastor Development line item in support of our Pastors and an increase in our insurance premium.

With the reduction in income and the increase in expenses the Session approved a 2021 budget with a Budget Contingency (the projected shortfall between income and expenses) of \$112,611. How was the Session able to do this? The Session has Faith that the Congregation will respond with their continued generous giving and the Session will be diligent in looking for ways to reduce spending.

Also, this was possible because of the generous giving of the Congregation in the past. We have gone the past three years with fully meeting or exceeding our budgeted giving and reducing our expenses. These extra dollars have been accumulated in the Session Discretionary Fund and available in times of need.

What can you do? I think back to Pastor Daniel's sermon in early August on 1 Thessalonians Chapter 5 verses 16-18: "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, and give thanks in all circumstances to God the Father in the name of his son Christ Jesus, for this is his will for you."

May Westminster rejoice in the good financial situation of 2020, be in prayer for 2021 and give thanks for God's will to be done in our Congregation.
