### LETTER FROM BIRMINGHAM JAIL

Martin Luther King, Jr. wrote this letter from jail in 1963 in response to a group of moderate clergy urging him to "wait," have patience, and trust the system to bring about change. His letter still has meaning today: *"We know through painful experience that freedom is never voluntarily given by the oppressor; it must be demanded by the oppressed. Frankly, I have never yet engaged in a direct-action movement that was "well timed" according to the timetable of those who have not suffered unduly from the disease of segregation. For years now I have heard the word "wait." It rings in the ear of every Negro with a piercing familiarity. This "wait" has almost always meant "never.""*

**FROM THE WESTMINSTER PULPIT**

The resurrection of Jesus Christ is the most important event in the history of the world. In the resurrection of Jesus, death is undone and the curse is broken. It is why the message of the earliest Christians was focused on the resurrection. They did not risk their lives to proclaim a gospel of “be nice like Jesus.” They risked their lives to declare the resurrection: Jesus is victorious over death, and the ones who are in him share in that victory. ## COVID PROTOCOLS FOR IN-PERSON WORSHIP

*Thank you for following these protocols which enable weekly in-person worship without interruption.*

1. Following the guidance of the CDC and our concern for the most vulnerable, masks are required for all who are Kindergarten and older, vaccinated and unvaccinated, as they enter all buildings. The Session has approved a move to mask optional on campus after the first of the year, provided Charleston County reaches an area of low disease activity according to SCDHEC. Charleston County currently (12/28) has a high disease activity rating.
