FIRE AT THE PALMS: TELLING THE STORY

On the morning of Monday, February 7, there was a terrible fire at the Palms Apartment Complex right up the road from the church. Folks from Westminster were moved to action immediately, calling the Red Cross to see what support we could offer to the ones who were displaced. In a matter of hours, Westminster became an overnight emergency shelter for anyone in



need, and we started collecting clothes and supplies for the ones who needed it most. On Tuesday morning, our first resources were offered to a fire victim- an individual who had spent the night at the church before catching a flight for a graduate course out of town.

Over the course of the next few days, resources started pouring in- aided by how quickly the word was spreading. We called for volunteers to come sort and organize the resources, and what a response we had! Getting organized quickly enabled us to start distribution on Tuesday and continue it through Saturday. You can see in the picture what Covenant Hall looked like during the week- the response was so great, we even had to call for a temporary pause in donations.

Through the week, we were able to meet families, hear their stories, and offer what support we could. We were also able to make many connections with other non-profits and relief organizations who were assisting. One group, West Ashley Connects, found space at Citadel Mall where families could go as needed, and on Saturday, we merged our inventory with theirs. It appears we were able to provide important assistance right away, and now the long-term relief will be coordinated at the mall.

Looking back at it, I am a proud pastor for several reasons:

- The compassion of our members to get and keep the ball rolling.
- The willingness of WPC volunteers to work hard to get a good system in place for assistance. Among the large group of people who helped in various ways, Brenda Gibson (Mission Elder), Jim Frye (with Hands of Christ wisdom), and especially Molly Griggs, as the Westminster coordinator, did a tremendous job.
- Dale Norman, WPC Elder and chaplain with Coastal Crisis Chaplaincy (another ministry we support) for his compassionate work all week at the Palms with families and emergency response workers.
- The reputation Westminster has in the community. On Monday evening, the Red Cross contact said to me: "I was thinking about a local place we might offer for emergency assistance, and I thought of the Presbyterian Church because I can tell through the North Bridge project you all really care about the community."
- I'm mostly proud for the sensitivity to the leading of the Spirit last week. It was at times fast-moving and chaotic, but even when we were not sure what to do next, we were certain of God's leading, and the Spirit illumined the path forward.
- I'm proud of the conversations about healthy mission work this event sparked. We talked about things like being aware of our motivations in serving others. And when the response to the fire clearly outdistanced the need, we talked about lifting our eyes to the needs in our community that are always present and how we don't have to wait for tragedy to act. That resource outpost at the mall will serve this community well beyond the families affected.

Looking ahead, I invite you to continue in prayer and action for the ones recovering from the fire. The stories they shared last week were both heart breaking and encouraging, because in their grief, many of them were feeling the love of the church and community in the immediate aftermath of being displaced. I also feel compelled to invite you into that kind of discipleship: serving others as God puts them in your path.
