GREETINGS From Pastor Lissa

Dear Friends,

This is one of those years where Lent feels 'early' and bunched up next to the Christmas season. Some years are like that...where Jesus takes hold and we are diving in one liturgical season to the next, right after each other and only a breath of space between.

There are two ways we can approach Lent on years like this one: we can stomp our feet and say 'I'm not ready!' or we can sit down, take a breath and say 'Here am I'. Truthfully, I have been in my vocation long enough that I have tried both ways and one way hurts and one way fills my cup. I will let you guess which one is which.

Here is why one works well and the other does not. First, fighting what is going to be uses energy you don't have for something you don't need to press against. Lent is coming whether you approve or not. Lent is hard for me each year on top of the spiritual journey we take in recognizing Jesus died so that we could live fully in relationship with God and each other. All four of my grandparents died within six weeks of each other. Not the same year, but within the same time period in Lent. My grieving changes from year to year, but that time frame is just tough. When I push against Lent and stomp my feet, I inhibit the healing that can come through the practice of Lent with worship, readings, prayer and resting in God's grace. When I lean in, I am physically, spiritually, and mentally allowing time to grieve (which is necessary) and time to heal. Second, God calls out to us just as we call out to God. God came to us through God's son Jesus and invited us to 'come and follow me'. We get to Walk With Jesus Daily. Lent is intentional. Lent is listening to the Holy Spirit. Lent is being humble. Lent is being vulnerable. Lent is the season where we can prepare for the glorious witness of Easter.

Friends, I invite you to pray about how you will approach Lent this year. Will you lean in or will you stomp your feet? Either way, God loves you, but one way will fill your cup and one way will be exhausting. I don't know about you, but I much prefer to wake up on Easter morning rested and ready to proclaim "HE IS HERE!!! Christ is risen indeed!"

Ash Wednesday is the beginning of Lent. It's called Ash Wednesday because as a sign of repentance, believers through the centuries have received the mark of an ashen cross on their forehead. The ashes remind us of God's words to Adam when he sinned- "remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return," and it reminds us of the Old Testament practice of wearing sackcloth and having ashes placed on the head as a sign of spiritual poverty. On February 22, there are several opportunities to gather.



MINUTE FOR MISSION WPC Ministry in the Community & Beyond

- Thank you to everyone who worked to make the Angel Tree such a good show of love. Westminster adopted and shopped for 127 angels- each representing a Child at Mary Ford. You pulled 79 angels from the tree and shopped for them and gave enough money (more than \$4,000) so the youth could shop for the other 48 angels. Special thanks to the Mission Committee and Pastor Lissa and everyone who leaned into this wonderful mission opportunity.
- The 3-5th grade class continues to grow in number and in discipleship. Kids are engaged and growing in Christ!
- Westminster collected and distributed over 400 coats during December. Coats were distributed to students at Mary Ford, Chicora, and Goodwin Schools. Adult sizes were distributed at Neighbors together in North Charleston.
- Westminster hosts and supports Pack 79 and Troop 79. Recently Griffin completed his Eagle project: drainage maintenance and improving the bridge and walk between Westminster and our neighbors at Viviant Health. Well done, Griffin!
- In 2022, your gifts made a difference in the community!
 - \$24,000 worth of food distributed through the Westminster Food Pantry, one family at a time.
 - \$18,650 worth of food distributed in area schools through the BackPack Buddies program.
 - And at the Christmas Eve Services, we collected \$3,076 for Thornwell. This gift is in addition to our annual \$10,000 gift to Thornwell.
- We Love and Support Mary Ford Learning Center! At Wonderful Wednesday on January 18, Mary Ford teachers joined us for supper. Here, Principal Loretta Scott shares news from the Mary Ford community. Did you know in the Mary Ford community, the median household income is \$30,866, 18% of the residents have no healthcare coverage, 32% are below the poverty line, and 27% are households where grandparents are raising the grandchildren? Still, the Mary Ford Family keeps moving ahead, and with our help, things at the school are changing. She shared the great news of improving test scores and invited us to keep our relationship strong!
