All through 2023, we'll be engaged in a verse-by-verse study of the Gospel. If you would like a special copy of Matthew from The Illuminated Scripture Journal for following along and taking notes, they are available for you in the narthex. They are a gift for you provided you read it and use it!

Here's the schedule for the next few weeks.

- January 29: Matthew 4:12-22; Called to a New Vision: The call of Christ is to leave our nets and invest in the work of the Kingdom of God.
- February 5: Matthew 4:23-25; Understanding the Kingdom of God: The broken places of the world are restored as the Kingdom advances in Jesus' ministry.
- February 12: Matthew 5:1-16; The Sermon on the Mount I: The Path to True Happiness: In the Beatitudes, Jesus describes those who are truly blessed in the Kingdom of God.
- February 19: Matthew 5:17-48; The Sermon on the Mount II: Ethics of the Heart: In the Kingdom of God, disciples are motivated out of a changed heart- not legalistic observance of the law.

## **ASH WEDNESDAY IS FEBRUARY 22**

Ash Wednesday is the beginning of Lent. It's called Ash Wednesday because, as a sign of repentance, believers through the centuries have received the mark of an ashen cross on their forehead. The ashes remind us of God's words to Adam when he sinned- "remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return," and it reminds us of the Old Testament practice of wearing sackcloth and having ashes placed on the head as a sign of spiritual poverty.

On February 22, there are several opportunities to gather:

- 8:00- 8:15 am and 12:15-12:30 pm Brief gatherings in the sanctuary to pray and be marked with the ashes of repentance.
- 6:30 -7:15 pm Ash Wednesday worship where we hear God's word of hope and are marked with the ashes of repentance.






