All through 2023, we'll be engaged in a verse-by-verse study of the Gospel. Here is the Schedule for the next few weeks:

- May 21 Matthew 12:38-50 Conflict with the Pharisees 3: On Signs and Doing the Will of God
Jesus compares his death and resurrection to the trials of the prophet Jonah.
- May 28 Acts 2:1-21 All Together: The experience of Pentecost is pivotal in the formation of the Church. What does it mean 2000 years later?
- June 4 Matthew 13:1-23 Kingdom Parables 1 - The Sower: Jesus compares the Kingdom to a sower who sows seed in 4 types of soil
- June 11 Matthew 13:24-43 Kingdom Parables 2 - The Weeds, the Mustard Seed, and the Net: Jesus compares the Kingdom to a field of wheat and weeds, a tiny mustard seed, and a small amount of yeast.

In 1968 Easter fell ten days after the assassination of Martin Luther King Jr., and this text was written to express an Easter hope while mindful of that terrible event. Buoyed by a triple-arched tune, it affirms the presence of a wounded, risen Christ with all who suffer.
