WE'RE STUDYING MATTHEW!

All through 2023, we'll be engaged in a verse-by-verse study of the Gospel. Here is the Schedule for the next few weeks:

- May 7 Matthew 12:1-21 Conflict with the Pharisees 1: On Keeping the Sabbath
When questioned by the Pharisees about breaking the Sabbath, Jesus teaches that he is Lord of the Sabbath.
- May 14 Matthew 12:22-37 Conflict with the Pharisees 2: On Demons and the Holy Spirit
Jesus uses the demon conflict to teach: good trees bear good fruit and bad trees bear bad fruit.
- May 21 Matthew 12:38-50 Conflict with the Pharisees 3: On Signs and Doing the Will of God
Jesus compares his death and resurrection to the trials of the prophet Jonah.
- May 28 Matthew 13:1-23 Kingdom Parables 1 - The Sower
Jesus compares the Kingdom to a sower who sows seed in four types of soil
- June 4 Matthew 13:24-43 Kingdom Parables 2 - The Weeds, the Mustard Seed, and the Net
Jesus compares the Kingdom to a field of wheat and weeds, a tiny mustard seed, and a small amount of yeast.

This hymn resembles many 18th-century drawings that show parallels between worship on earth and worship in heaven, especially as described in Revelation 7:9–11. This 18th-century tune has had many names; the one used here honors the dynasty of British monarchs, 1714–1901.
