From Pastor Daniel

And he called the twelve and began to send them out two by two, and gave them authority over the unclean spirits. He charged them to take nothing for their journey except a staff—no bread, no bag, no money in their belts...Mark 6:7-8

Pretty early on in his ministry, Jesus sends out the 12 disciples to proclaim the Kingdom of Heaven and to heal. They are doing Kingdom work in his name, as an extension of his love.

I've always been intrigued by the "pack light" strategy. I used to think was employed as a way to get the disciples to trust in God for what they need along the way, but lately I've expanded that view to think Jesus must have wanted them to be dependent not just on God but also upon the people they were going out to reach. Think of the lessons they must have learned along the way! For us, those lessons are a corrective to our assumptions that we have all the answers, resources, and power in ministry. What if, in our efforts to reach "the least of these," we START with the idea that we need them as much or more than they need us? It is humbling to think we are called to work together for solutions to real world problems, but it is a lesson I'm sure the under-packed disciples learned quickly. Maybe we can be just as teachable.

We need each other.

NEW WESTMINSTER/METANOIA MISSION FUND

We are so glad to announce the creation of the Westminster/Metanoia Mission Fund. An anonymous donor is giving \$50,000 to WPC to support our growing partnership with Metanoia and the amazing work they are doing in North Charleston. Metanoia and Westminster will work together to identify the proper use of the funds. We intend to primarily support Metanoia's Youth Leadership Academy.

MYLA builds leaders of character, excellence, and presence. Their youth leadership pipeline identifies and invests in the assets of each leader from elementary to high school. They partner with parents, schools, and the larger community to facilitate rigorous and holistic youth development; pushing forward to create life-long learners equipped to contribute and serve as community citizens. MYLA offers year-round out-of-school programming for scholars recommended for showing leadership potential. This includes attentive daily afterschool programming and Metanoia's summer Children's Defense Fund Freedom School. We build outside partnerships that allow scholars to sharpen their skills and invest in their own interests.

GLOBAL MISSION UPDATES

We're glad to Welcome Rev. Mark Mueller of The Outreach Foundation to WPC on November 12. He'll preach, teach Sunday School, and meet with mission leaders to help us discern new global mission partnerships.
