Not everything that looks like a battle ends up being one. This text, written for a seminary graduation, works well with its martial tune in the first stanza; but later stanzas turn from such imagery and focus on "deeds of love and mercy" and courage for life's journey.

A WORD ABOUT LENT

Today is the Second Sunday in LENT. The word *lent* is from the Anglo-Saxon *lencten* which means *spring* or the *springtime*. Literally, it means the time of the year when the days *lengthen*. In the church, Lent is the 40-day period during which Christians rededicate themselves to follow Jesus Christ as His faithful disciples, and prepare to celebrate the Lord's resurrection at Easter. Many Christians vow to give up things (like desserts or TV) during Lent so that when they desire those things, they are reminded of their relationship with the Lord. Other Christians choose to take up something (like daily prayer or acts of kindness) during Lent to strengthen their faith. We're reading the bible together during LENT. GLOBAL MISSION OPPORTUNITIES!

We are so glad for growing Global Partnerships at Westminster.

+In **Guatemala**, the Presbyterian Church is renewing their commitment to building the LaPatria School. We're discerning the part we might play in that good work.

+In **Mexico**, we're learning about the Cistern Ministry of Todd Luke in the Yucatan. Todd works with local families in building rainwater cisterns so families can have a year-round supply of safe water. The church identifies the needs and works alongside families and mission teams to construct needed cisterns. Pastor Daniel and Ms. Claire are leading a team of older students (who missed the opportunity for global mission because of Covid) July 1-7, 2024.

+In **Brazil**, we partner with Felipe and Laura Mathias in their ministry to the children in the slums of Sao Paulo. Life in the slums is hard, but the Lighthouse is a beacon of hope where children can learn about Jesus and experience the love God has for them. Pastor Priscilla Holtzclaw is leading a team of adults July 17-24, 2024.

To indicate your interest in being a team member, fill out the online application by Today. (See the ENEWS) The total cost of each trip is about \$1900, and the cost will be divided between participant contribution, the church's Global Mission Fund, and group fundraising.

WATER MISSIONS WALK FOR WATER COMING SOON!

BACKPACK BUDDIES

WPC provides a weekend backpack of easy-to-prepare food to children at risk for weekend hunger. Westminster's partnership is currently with Goodwin Elementary School. We are packing food for children whose weekend meals are funded by grant partners. All together we pack food once a month for 110 children each weekend...or to look at it from our perspective on Wednesday nights, we are packing about 440 bags each month. We also partner with St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church by providing funding while they provide the labor to pick up, pack and deliver the food to Stono Park Elementary School.

Backpack Buddies is not supported though the budget here at Westminster. The support comes through designated donations and your giving was strong for the first fifteen years...but that has changed! I am here today to remind you that we need your donations to continue feeding the children we are feeding today! It takes about \$25,000 each year. Perhaps you could sponsor a child or two in honor of your own child or grandchild. Sponsoring one child each school year would cost \$200. Perhaps you could honor a confirmation partner or Sunday School teacher by donating in their honor. Perhaps your children could host a lemonade stand in their neighborhood to help! Please remember that this is not a one-time plea but an ongoing need.

To summarize, you can help in two ways:

- come help pack on designated Wednesday nights, the next one is February 28! Dinner is at 6 pm and packing starts about 6:30 pm. We normally finish by 7:00 pm.
