This hymn develops the imagery of Jesus' remark (Matthew 7:24-27/Luke 6:47-49) that those who believe in him and act on that belief are like someone who builds a house on a rock. The text is set to a tune created for it by a prolific 19th-century American composer and editor.

Sometimes this prolific 19th-century hymnwriter wrote texts for others to set, and sometimes she created words for tunes others had composed. This text was of the second kind, and the resulting close fit between words and music has made them both popular and inseparable.

A WORD ABOUT LENT

Today is the Fifth Sunday in LENT. The word *lent* is from the Anglo-Saxon *lencten* which means *spring* or the *springtime*. Literally, it means the time of the year when the days *lengthen*. In the church, Lent is the 40 day period during which Christians rededicate themselves to follow Jesus Christ as His faithful disciples, and prepare to celebrate the Lord's resurrection at Easter. Many Christians vow to give up things (like desserts or TV) during Lent so that when they desire those things, they are reminded of their relationship with the Lord. Other Christians choose to take up something (like daily prayer or acts of kindness) during Lent to strengthen their faith. We're reading the bible together during LENT. The Presbyterian Church in Congo has perhaps 2,250,000 members (roughly 2x the size of the PCUSA) and has thousands of churches, over a thousand elementary schools, medical clinics and hospitals, a seminary and university. THANK YOU FOR YOUR GENEROSITY FOR BACKPACK BUDDIES!

A few weeks ago, we identified a need for Backpack Buddies funding, and you have responded generously! In the past few weeks \$12,413 has been given to this important ministry. Thank you!!

About Backpack Buddies: WPC provides a weekend backpack of easy-to-prepare food to children at risk for weekend hunger. Westminster's partnership is currently with Goodwin Elementary School. We are packing food for children whose weekend meals are funded by grant partners. All together we pack food once a month for 110 children each weekend...or to look at it from our perspective on Wednesday nights, we are packing about 440 bags each month. We also partner with St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church by providing funding while they provide the labor to pick up, pack and deliver the food to Stono Park Elementary School. It is an outreach needing about \$25,000 a year.

You can help in two ways:

- Come help pack on designated Wednesday nights. The next one is March 27! Dinner is at 6 pm and packing starts about 6:30 pm. We normally finish by 7:00 pm.
