YOU'RE INVITED! ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL STARTS AUGUST 25

- The Anchor Class: This class emphasizes fellowship, good discussion, and growth. They will be studying Eugene Peterson's Leap Over a Wall, which is a study of the life of David. We'll learn discipleship from the high points and low points of the one described as "a man after God's own heart." Class meets in Room 15 of the Education Building.
- The Cary Grayson Class: This class is facilitated by a team of leaders and has been engaged in a study of the Old Testament for quite a while. They take about a chapter a week for study and reflection and are currently in the book of 1 Samuel. Class meets in Room 4 of Covenant Hall.
- The New Class: We are creating a new Sunday School class, inviting folks who are not currently involved in an adult class on Sunday mornings. Here is what you can expect: An opportunity to meet and build relationships with a range of people: some you already know and some you don't yet know; An opportunity to learn more about both *why* we study the bible and *how* we can study the bible; A range of class facilitators who will keep things moving and interesting; An initial 8-week study of the New Testament book of Philippians. Philippians is all about joy, interruptions, discouragement, hope, partnerships, and Jesus. We're using NT Wright's Bible for Everyone Study Guide, and you can pick one up in class if you like. (\$10). Class meets in Covenant Hall.

With minimal revision this text brings together six of the eight four-line stanzas in an 18th-century hymn written for children and originally headed "Praise for Creation and Providence." The anonymous German tune provides a fitting sense of breadth and wonder.

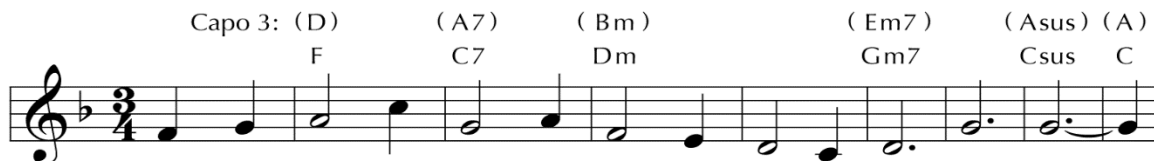

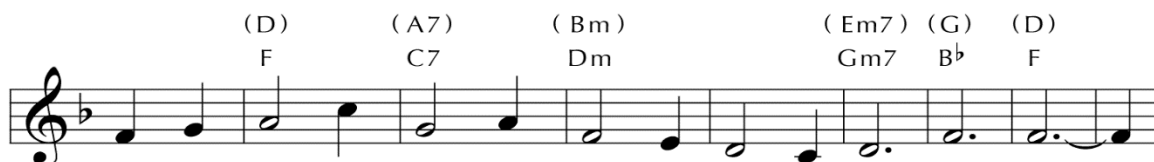
This hymn is a 21st-century adaptation of the traditional Celtic prayer style known as a *lorica* (Latin for "armor" or "breastplate"). Many such petitions for God's presence and protection were never written down, but this one is based on an example attributed to St. Patrick.

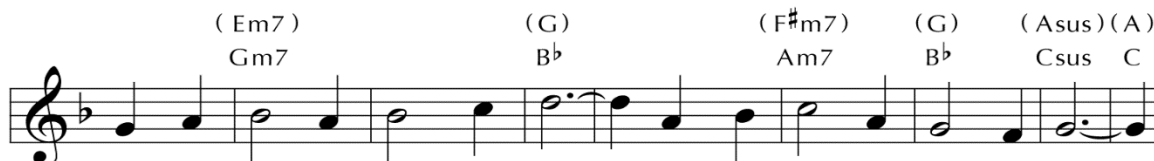

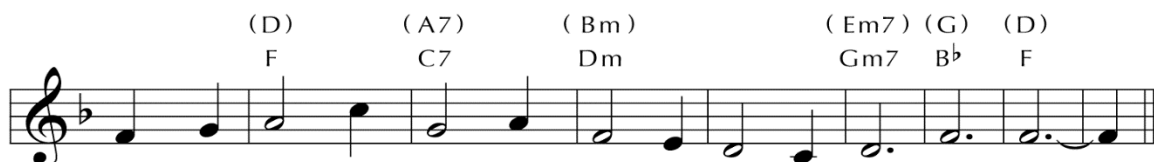
