January 26	Exodus 5-10: Hard-Hearted. The first 9 plagues and the hardening of Pharaoh's heart.
February 2	Exodus 11-13: Passover. The tenth plague and the Passover.

YOU'RE INVITED! ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL

January 12: Pause and Refresh for "Facing Racism"

"The Beloved Community: A Vision of Martin Luther King, Jr."

Natasha Akery will introduce participants to the concept of the Beloved Community and what that means for us as Christians who seek to dismantle racism in our world and ourselves. We meet in Covenant Hall from 10:00 - 10:45.

Classes beginning on January 19

The Anchor Class: This class emphasizes fellowship, good discussion, and growth. For 12 weeks, they will be studying the Gospel of Luke using J.I. Packer's series entitled "Knowing the Bible." Luke is the most thorough historical account of the birth, life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ., but Luke's Gospel is more than just history; it's also a rich source of life-giving theology, revealing Jesus' identity as Israel's long-awaited Messiah and the Redeemer of the world. Books will be available in class. Class is led by David Jump and meets in Room 15 of the Education Building.

The Cary Grayson Class: This class is facilitated by a team of leaders that engage in a study and reflection of the Bible. The peers bring their ideas, knowledge, and understanding of the Bible to accentuate on their outlook of the Lord's teachings. The current book being reviewed is 2 Samuel. A variety of outlooks are always welcome! Class meets in Room 4 of Covenant Hall.

The New Class: The first thing we're going to do is name the class that is not so "new" anymore, and then we are going to dive into the book of Jonah. For 6 weeks, we'll see ourselves in the story of the reluctant prophet who just had to do things his own way. Emphasis is on fellowship, prayer, study, and learning how to study the Bible. It's a great option for beginners and seasoned Christians. This class is led by Pastor Daniel and Lindy Coleman. It meets in the Church Parlor.

Facing Racism (Begins January 26):

Limited to 12 participants for 6 weeks. Facilitated by Natasha & Matt Akery, participants will learn about racism in the context of Christianity through curriculum designed by PC-USA. It requires weekly reading and discussion meetings in the library during the Sunday School hour. It is designed for those who are interested in continuing antiracism work through discipleship and community involvement when the class concludes. READ GOOD BOOKS IN 2025!

Join Pastor Daniel in reading any (or all!) of these books in 2025. A variety of topics, authors, and genres, the choices are designed to stimulate the heart and mind and be a catalyst for growth in discipleship. Read each in preparation for the group discussion at 5:00 p.m. on the 4th Sunday of every other month. Books may be purchased online or at church (\$10 for *Jesus and the Disinherited*)

- **On February 23rd** we'll discuss Howard Thurman's landmark book, *Jesus and the Disinherited*. Thurman was the first to claim that Jesus Christ - who was born in poverty as part of a powerless minority - lived a life that spoke directly to Black Americans. Martin Luther King, Jr. not only regularly attended Thurman's services, but he carried Thurman's writings with him on the historic marches to Selma and Birmingham. King found Thurman to be a treasure and often drew from him in his own speeches and writings. Congressman John Lewis called Howard Thurman the "patron saint" of the Civil Rights Movement.
- **On April 27th** we'll discuss Dietrich Bonhoeffer's *Life Together*.
- **On June 22nd** we'll discuss Peter Aelred's *To Melt a Golden Calf*.
- **On August 24th** we'll discuss C.S Lewis's *The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe*.
- **On October 26th** we'll discuss John Mark Comer's *The Ruthless Elimination of Hurry*.
- **In December (date TBD)** we'll discuss Fleming Rutledge's *Advent*.

GLOBAL MISSION TRIP OPPORTUNITIES IN 2025!

We are so glad for growing Global Partnerships at Westminster.

- ➔ In **Mexico**, we're returning to share in the Cistern Ministry of Todd Luke in the Yucatan. Todd works with local families in building rainwater cisterns so families can have a year-round supply of safe water. The church identifies the needs and works alongside families and mission teams to construct needed cisterns. There are two opportunities in 2025: a team of adults March 24-29 (\$200 deposit due ASAP) and a team of High School Juniors & Seniors July 7-12. (\$200 deposit due 2/14)
- ➔ In **Brazil**, we partner with Felipe and Laura Mathias in their ministry to the children in the slums of Sao Paulo. Life in the slums is hard, but the Lighthouse is a beacon of hope where children can learn about Jesus and experience the love God has for them. We are returning with a team of adults and youth/children (with a parent) July 16-23. (\$200 deposit due 2/14)

An informational meeting is set for January 12 at 4:00 pm. To indicate your interest in being a team member, speak with Pastor Daniel dsmoak@wpccharleston.org or Pastor Priscilla. The total cost of each trip is about \$2000, and the cost will be divided in thirds between participant contribution, the church's Global Mission Fund, and group fundraising.







Written for Pentecost by a British Baptist pastor, this text is full of biblical terms like "Ebenezer" (1 Samuel 7:12), Hebrew for "a stone of help" set up to give thanks for God's assistance. The tune name honors hymnal compiler Asahel Nettleton, who probably did not compose it.

The opening line here is essentially a quotation of 2 Corinthians 5:7, but that affirmation is fleshed out by references to the appearance of the risen Christ to Thomas (John 20:19–29). The shape note tune, named for a stream in Fayette County, Pennsylvania, adds resolution to the words.

Few Welsh hymns are as well known or loved as this 18th-century text that did not gain its popular tune until the early 20th century. In both its original text and in English translation, it is a stirring hymn of pilgrimage filled with vivid imagery from Hebrew Scripture.
