WE WALK WITH JESUS: GROWING IN STUDY AND FELLOWSHIP THROUGH SUNDAY SCHOOL FOR ADULTS

August 31: Classes have organizational meetings

September 7: Classes begin!

- **The Anchor Class:** This class emphasizes fellowship, good discussion, and growth. They will be studying the book of Acts, using resources from Bible scholar N.T. Wright. Trace the development of the early church and the power of the Holy Spirit, drawing parallels to the ways we follow Jesus today. Facilitated by David Jump; Class meets in Room 15 of the Education Building.
- **The Cary Grayson Class:** This class is facilitated by a team of leaders that engage in a study and reflection of the Bible. The peers bring their ideas, knowledge, and understanding of the Bible to accentuate on their outlook of the Lord's teachings. The current book being reviewed is 2 Kings. A variety of outlooks are always welcome! Class meets in Room 4 of Covenant Hall.
- **The LIFE Class:** Want to know more about the Bible and how to study it? We'll spend 7 weeks using Donald Griggs's *The Bible from Scratch: The Old Testament for Beginners*. We'll review themes and people, explore the foundations of our faith, and learn how to study the Bible for ourselves. Class is facilitated by Lindy Coleman and Pastor Priscilla and meets in the library.
- **The After Party:** A 6-week video and discussion course designed to help Christians navigate today's challenging political environment. It's no secret that the church has been challenged by extreme polarization, entrenched tribal affiliations, and the broken relationships that often result. This course is both inspiring and practical and will help you reorient your heart and mind towards a Christ-centered political identity. We'll consider the "how vs. the "what" of politics, and explore what the Bible has to say about it all. Facilitated by Daniel Smoak and Natasha Akery. Class is full but will be offered again.

ON THE FIRST WEDNESDAY OF THE MONTH W.E. PACK!

When we kick off Wonderful Wednesdays on September 3, we will also kick off another year of snacks (Weekend Eats) for students! After supper on the first Wednesday of every month, we take about 30-45 minutes to pack snack kits for Goodwin and Mary Ford students who are facing weekend food insecurity. We pack enough for 300 students a week to go home with a bag of nutritious snacks. It is a fun and meaningful mission opportunity for all ages. You can support this important ministry financially. READ GOOD BOOKS IN 2025!

Join Pastor Daniel in reading any (or all!) of these books in 2025. A variety of topics, authors, and genres, the choices are designed to stimulate the heart and mind and be a catalyst for growth in discipleship. Read each in preparation for the group discussion on the 4th Sunday of every other month. Books may be purchased online or at church (\$10 for *The Ruthless Elimination of Hurry*)

- On October 26th we'll discuss John Mark Comer's *The Ruthless Elimination of Hurry*. Philosopher Dallas Willard said "Hurry is the great enemy of spiritual life in our day, and we must ruthlessly eliminate from our lives." Carl Jung said "hurry is not of the devil; it is the devil." Corrie Ten Boom said, "If the devil can't make you sin, he'll make you hurry." In this popular title from recent years, Pastor Comer explores how to stay emotionally healthy and spiritually alive in the chaos of the modern world. He makes the case that love, joy, and peace are at the heart of all Jesus is trying to grow in the soil of your life, and all three are incompatible with hurry. If you are frustrated with and drained by the relentless pace of life, this is a book you need to read.
- In December (date TBD) we'll discuss Fleming Rutledge's *Advent*.

The class will meet on Sunday mornings after the children are dismissed following the Time to Shine at the 11:00 a.m. service. CHURCH OF THE ARTS: A NEW CHURCH DEVELOPMENT IN PARK CIRCLE


Today we are so glad to welcome the Organizing Pastor of Church of the Arts, Rev. Tricia Petraven, to the Westminster pulpit. In the Presbyterian Church (USA), as new worshipping communities and new churches are developed, it is important that they remain connected to existing congregations and presbyteries for support, encouragement, and accountability. As an NCD (New Church Development) of the Charleston-Atlantic Presbytery, meeting primarily in presbytery space in Park Circle, The Church of the Arts will be primarily supported through the work of the presbytery. In addition, Westminster also agrees to be a partner church until such time as Church of the Arts should be deemed ready to become an organized congregation. In doing so, Westminster commits to pray, share resources, financially support, promote, and partner in ministry together.

ABOUT PASTOR TRICIA: Tricia Petraven is an artist and a former scenic designer for the stage, who became a pastor as a second career. She believes in using our creativity and imagination to make art that points us to Jesus and helps us to see God's love. After graduating from seminary 10 years ago with an M.Div., Tricia soon became a trained transitional minister, especially being drawn to churches that had experienced trauma. She found her artistic approach to worship was particularly helpful when dealing with brokenness and healing through grief. Tricia states, "In today's world of short attention spans and social media, we need to engage with our beliefs and our faith even more intentionally. It's not enough to be a passive listener in church. What keeps our faith on fire is participating in worship with as much as we can, with all our gifts, all our questions, all our talents, all our complicated lives. Then it becomes vital, it heals our hurts and gives us meaning."


CHURCH OF THE ARTS CALENDAR

This hymn was one of twelve written by an English curate to affirm the articles of the Apostles' Creed with biblical allusions such as 1 Corinthians 3:11 here. Though not created for this text, the tune was joined to it in 1868, and the two have been inseparable ever since.
