AMAZING THINGS HAPPEN WHEN YOU SING WITH THE CHOIR!

In 1973, inventor Arthur Fry attended a seminar given by 3M scientist Spencer Silver on an adhesive Silver had "accidentally" developed years earlier. In an attempt to create a strong adhesive to be used in the aerospace industry, Silver ended up creating a weak, temporary adhesive that had yet to be put to practical use. Fry was an avid singer in his church choir, and used bookmarks to organize his choir folder and hymnal. One Sunday, as his bookmarks clumsily slipped out of place, it occurred to Fry that Silver's weak, reusable adhesive could perfectly hold his bookmarks in place without damaging his music, and the Post-It was born. You never know what amazing things might happen if you join the choir. You may invent something that changes the world! At the very least, you will learn a lot, enjoy fellowship, and enhance the worship of all who attend WPC. We rehearse Wednesday at 7- make yourself a post-it!

A variety of topics, authors, and genres, the choices are designed to stimulate the heart and mind and be a catalyst for growth in discipleship. - On August 24th we'll discuss C.S Lewis's *The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe*. Four adventurous siblings—Peter, Susan, Edmund, and Lucy Pevensie—step through a wardrobe door and into the land of Narnia, a land frozen in eternal winter and enslaved by the power of the White Witch. But when almost all hope is lost, the return of the Great Lion, Aslan, signals a great change . . . and a great sacrifice. This is the second book in C. S. Lewis's classic fantasy series, which has been drawing readers of all ages into a magical land with unforgettable characters for over sixty years. **This is a GREAT book for kids' summer reading!**

- In December (date TBD) we'll discuss Fleming Rutledge's Advent.

There will be opportunities to sign up to help with events, for new member and visitor outreach, to provide meals for youth, and more! Children and Youth Sunday School kicks off with "Meet the Teacher" 10:00-10:30 a.m. Sunday School students of all ages are invited to visit their classrooms, meet their teachers, and mingle with their classmates. Parents can drop off children and youth to their classrooms to stay for a fun activity. At 10:30, teachers will lead their classrooms to Covenant Hall for the Ministry Fair and reunion with parents.

WE WALK WITH JESUS: GROWING IN STUDY AND FELLOWSHIP THROUGH SUNDAY SCHOOL FOR ADULTS

August 24: Pause and Refresh on "Sharing Power"

What do the writers of the Creation Story want us to know about God's ways? Participants will be introduced to the literary features and narrative details in Genesis 1 that reveal a God who shares power. Participants will consider what power looks like in their lives, examine when it has been withheld or shared, and determine next steps for embodying ways of a creative and generous God. Led by Natasha Akery; for youth and adults. We meet in Covenant Hall from 10:00 – 10:45.

August 31: Classes have organizational Meetings

September 7: Classes begin!

- The Anchor Class: This class emphasizes fellowship, good discussion, and growth. They will be studying the book of Acts, using resources from Bible scholar N.T. Wright. Trace the development of the early church and the power of the Holy Spirit, drawing parallels to the ways we follow Jesus today. Facilitated by David Jump; Class meets in Room 15 of the Education Building.
- The Cary Grayson Class: This class is facilitated by a team of leaders that engage in a study and reflection of the Bible. The peers bring their ideas, knowledge, and understanding of the Bible to accentuate on their outlook of the Lord's teachings. The current book being reviewed is 2 Kings. A variety of outlooks are always welcome! Class meets in Room 4 of Covenant Hall.
- The LIFE Class: Want to know more about the Bible and how to study it? We'll spend 7 weeks using Donald Griggs's The Bible from Scratch: The Old Testament for Beginners. We'll review themes and people, explore the foundations of our faith, and learn how to study the Bible for ourselves. Class is facilitated by Lindy Coleman and Pastor Priscilla and meets in the library.
- The After Party: A 6-week video and discussion course designed to help Christians navigate today's challenging political environment. It's no secret that the church has been challenged by extreme polarization, entrenched tribal affiliations, and the broken relationships that often result. This course is both inspiring and practical and will help you reorient your heart and mind towards a Christ-centered political identity. We'll consider the "how vs. the "what" of politics, and explore what the Bible has to say about it all. Facilitated by Daniel Smoak and Natasha Akery. DEACONS AT WESTMINSTER

At Westminster, Deacons are called and ordained to a ministry of service and caring. From the days of the early church, Deacons have been men and women of compassion, sharing in the redeeming love of Jesus Christ for all people, especially the ones with special needs. There are 33 Deacons at Westminster, elected by the congregation for 3 year terms. Our Deacons are divided into 4 Teams

- THE SUNSHINE TEAM sends birthday cards and care notes out to everyone in the Westminster family. We want everyone to feel loved, included, and affirmed on special occasions.
- THE HOPE TEAM reaches out to the ones in the Westminster family who are homebound, facing or recovering from medical issues, pregnancy and birth, walking through a season of grief, or having other special needs. This care may come in the form of calls/texts/mail, visits, or coordinated meals. (HOPE stands for Helping Other Presbyterians Everyday).
- THE HOSPITALITY TEAM helps visitors and new members find their way in the life and ministry of Westminster. Special care is offered to people for about a year after becoming part of the Westminster family: inviting them to special events, answering questions about the church, and making sure they have a friendly face they can rely on in the congregation.
- THE DEACONS ON DEMAND TEAM helps the Westminster family with immediate needs; visits to the hospitalized, transportation to appointments, special errands, or a quick meal.

Deacons also coordinate funeral receptions, organize special days of caring, and seek ways to be of service to the congregation.
