### **GREETINGS: WE WALK WITH JESUS**

From Pastor Daniel

I've always been drawn to the way I heard a preacher describe learning to walk with Jesus. He pointed to the way farmers break in a new ox or horse on the farm. Particularly if the new animal was spirited, he would be placed right beside an older, seasoned one. The two would be yoked together and hitched to the plow. As the steady ox took a step forward, the young one would struggle, pushing and pulling in an effort to break free of the yoke and do his own thing. It wouldn't last long, though. Once the new animal settled in, the older one would take another step forward. The rebellion process would start all over, but the process worked. With each step, the rebellion lessened until the younger animal learned to walk in step with the older one.

The preacher said that's what it is like learning to walk with Jesus. Step by step, we learn from the one to whom we are yoked, and over time, the rebellion in us is tamped down.

It's not a bad way to think of discipleship.




### Westminster Welcomes Our New Office Administrator, Kate Cowart

At Westminster, Deacons are called and ordained to a ministry of service and caring. From the days of the early church, Deacons have been men and women of compassion, sharing in the redeeming love of Jesus Christ for all people, especially the ones with special needs. There are 33 Deacons at Westminster, elected by the congregation for 3 year terms.

### **DEACON TEAMS**

**SUNSHINE TEAM** sends birthday cards and care notes out to everyone in the Westminster family. We want everyone to feel loved, included, and affirmed on special occasions.

**THE HOPE TEAM** reaches out to the ones in the Westminster family who are homebound, facing or recovering from medical issues, pregnancy & birth, walking through a season of grief, or having other special needs. That care may come in the form of calls/texts/mail, visits, or coordinated meals. (HOPE stands for Helping Other Presbyterians Everyday).


**THE HOSPITALITY TEAM** helps visitors and new members find their way in the life and ministry of Westminster. Special care is offered to people for about a year after becoming part of the Westminster family: inviting them to special events, answering questions about the church, and making sure they have a friendly face they can rely on in the congregation.ther special needs. That care may come in the form of calls/texts/mail, visits, or coordinated meals. (HOPE stands for Helping Other Presbyterians Everyday)

**DEACONS ON DEMAND** team helps the Westminster family with immediate needs: visits to the hospitalized, special errands, a quick meal, or transportation to appointments.

Deacons also coordinate funeral receptions, organize special days of caring, and seek ways to be of service to the congregation.

### Highlights from the May Session Meeting

- We began with prayer and from Psalm 1, sharing times we've felt rooted and grounded in God's love.
- We enthusiastically endorsed Lindy Coleman to begin the South Carolina Lay School, exploring a call as a Commissioned Pastor.
- We celebrated the hiring of new Office administrator, Kate Cowart.
- We created a new 6 hr./wk. staff position, Assistant to the Pastor, and hired Nita Rushton to fill it.
- We agreed to be a Partner Church for the Church of the Arts: a new church development of our presbytery.
   Being a Partner Church means we pray, contribute, and even offer opportunities for our own members who feel called to participate in the birthing process.
- We kicked off Stewardship by receiving 2026 Estimate of Giving cards.
- We reviewed financial reports through July, giving thanks for numerous areas of mission involvement, including the opportunity to designate a gift of \$16,000 for Hands of Christ and \$10,500 for water cisterns in Mexico, and a \$34,000 pledge (over 4 years) to Church of the Arts in Park Circle.
