YOU CAN SUPPORT THE WESTMINSTER FOOD PANTRY and be a BIG help to those in our community with growing food insecurities.

The Westminster food pantry is one way we seek to love our neighbor. Every week 45 food bags are prepared for distribution to families in our community. Each bag is full of non-perishable food items like canned meat, pasta, vegetables, cereal, peanut butter, and fruit. Laundry detergent and diapers are also offered. The contents are more valuable than what it costs us to purchase in bulk and assemble each bag. During Thanksgiving and Christmas, we are also distributing certificates for a free turkey or ham in area grocery stores. So far this year, we've distributed \$22,000 in food to the community.

There is a growing need, and you can help.

- * Pick up an empty bag from the shopping cart in the narthex and return it with any items we distribute (a list is provided). Bring in other needed items

- * Bring in other needed items we distribute, such as: bar soap, toothpaste, toothbrushes, shampoo, and conditioner.

YOU ARE INVITED! WESTMINSTER IS HOSTING CHARLESTON AREA JUSTICE MINISTRY

(CAJM's) COMMUNITY PROBLEMS ASSEMBLY on Monday, November 17th from 6:30 - 8:00. CAJM is a local faith-based nonprofit dedicated to advocacy, social justice, and equality. The organization focuses on community issues like affordable housing, ethical governance in education, racial bias in police practices, and environmental protection. At this meeting, Westminster will be received as an official CAJM partner congregation, and all CAJM partners will hear some of the stories we and our neighbors are facing, voting on the campaigns we tackle for the coming year. After hosting over 70 house meetings (including 2 at WPC), our team leaders voted and identified the three most pressing problems facing our community:

- Transportation
- Homelessness
- Food Insecurity

Final voting is at this Community Problem Assembly. Only Network Members can vote, but it's not too late to commit (you can join at the assembly!). Also supporters are welcome (and encouraged!) to attend, even if you can't join CAJM yet. It's a great opportunity to see what this organization is all about!
