GOOD NEWS FROM SESSION

In the past two months, the Westminster Session has endorsed both Lindy Coleman and Janie Bruce for the Commissioned Lay Pastor track at the SC Lay School. They met with and have been approved by our Presbytery's Commission on Ministry, and in the spring they will start classes at the Lay School, engaging in courses on theology, pastoral care, biblical studies, worship, and polity to name a few. After they complete 8 courses over 4 years, they will be eligible to be commissioned by our Presbytery for service as Commissioned Lay Pastors (like Pastor Priscilla), serving any church in the Presbytery. While new clothing is preferred, gently used items (clean, with no holes or stains) are welcome.

Mary Ford also maintains a clothing closet for siblings and parents. Donations of clean adult clothing—as well as shoes and belts—are also appreciated.
