During Lent, we will pause to consider the cross and its meaning by exploring the Seven Last Words of Jesus. Interestingly, when it comes to the process of crucifixion, the Gospels do not dwell on gory details. Luke simply writes, *"When they came to the place that is called the Skull, there they crucified him."*

Instead, the Gospel writers draw our attention to what Jesus says while he is on the cross. In these final words, we discover the meaning of the cross itself:

- *Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do.*
- *Truly, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise.*
- *Woman, behold your son... behold your mother.*
- *My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?*
- *I thirst.*
- *It is finished.*
- *Father, into your hands I commit my spirit.*

I am eager to learn more with you and find the grace and love of God in the words of Jesus.

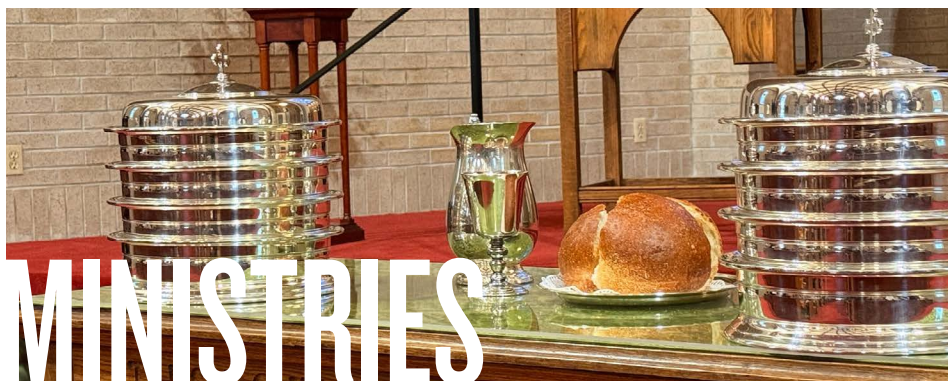

## CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

### 2026 Book Study Series

*Sunday, February 22*

**4:00 p.m.**

Join Pastor Daniel in reading books covering a variety of topics, authors, and genres. The choices are designed to stimulate the heart and mind and be a catalyst for growth in discipleship. Read in preparation for the group discussion at 4:00 p.m. on the 4th Sunday of every other month.

### On February 22nd we'll discuss Chinua Achebe's *Things Fall Apart*.

With more than twenty million copies sold and translated into fifty-seven languages, *Things Fall Apart* provides one of the most illuminating and permanent monuments to African experience. The story follows the tragic life of a high-performing but deeply flawed African native inhabiting an exalted place within his traditional Umuofia society which is under threat from European imperialists. Themes covered are: Colonialism and Cultural Change, Masculinity and Identity, and Tradition vs. Change. (Books are \$10 and available online or in the Narthex.)

### Adult Sunday School

## ASH WEDNESDAY

### Ash Wednesday February 18

*Ash Wednesday is the beginning of Lent. It's called Ash Wednesday because as a sign of repentance, believers through the centuries have received the mark of an ashen cross on their forehead. The ashes remind us of God's words to Adam when he sinned- "remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return," and it reminds us of the Old Testament practice of wearing sackcloth and having ashes placed on the head as a sign of spiritual poverty. On February 18, there are several opportunities to gather.*

## **FROM THE APNC**

The Associate Pastor Nominating Committee began our journey in April 2024. We were eager and earnest to serve our congregation and find an Associate Pastor best suited for our community. We prayed for the person God would eventually reveal to us; we prayed that God would prepare their heart for our church and turn their eye toward us. We prayed that God would grant them the same wisdom and discernment that we prayed for ourselves. God took time answering that prayer, showing us over the course of eighteen months the kind of person we wanted as Associate Pastor. We wanted someone who would complement Pastor Daniel and come alongside him as a motivated partner. Frankly, we felt like the right person might be a woman - this desire was clear to us after Pastor Lissa's departure and how the congregation has responded to Pastor Priscilla. We also wanted someone who would focus on adult discipleship with enthusiasm and creativity.

During those eighteen months, God was at work not only in our search, but also in the heart of Janie Bruce. During her work with Charleston Atlantic Presbytery and Charleston Youth Mission, she felt her interests and call shift toward adult ministry. Our Session of Elders affirmed her decision to enter Lay School, which she will begin in the Spring. All of this took place independent of the APNC's search, but as her journey came to light, the committee began to think outside the box. Janie is a God-fearing woman who loves our people, knows how to work well with Pastor Daniel, and can hit the ground running with good ideas that meet the needs of our community. We are thrilled to welcome Janie Bruce as our Director of Adult Discipleship while she attends Lay School to become a Commissioned Lay Pastor.

## **GET TO KNOW JANIE:**

**How long have you been a follower of Jesus? Tell us a little bit about your faith journey:**

*I am so blessed because as far as I can remember there has never been a day that I didn't know that I was loved by God and created for a purpose. I could never thank my parents enough for the faith that they helped instill in me. Church has always been a home for me and a place where I was encouraged to explore who I am and who I'm created to be. Because of my church-centric upbringing I see the importance of a strong Christ centered foundation. That is what led me to work in the church so many years ago. I wanted to help provide and build a foundation for the children and youth of Westminster. In more recent years, I have expanded that reach along with a love for mission and justice work into a different career path with Youth Mission Co in the founding of Charleston Youth Mission. My time with CYM has pushed me to be bolder in proclaiming what I know to be true and advocating for others who may not have had the same privileges.*

**Tell us about your calling to the position of Director of Adult Discipleship:**

*All I can say is that when the Holy Spirit pushes you, there really is no option but to jump.*

*After a successful 2025 summer with CYM, I began to feel the push to "do more." I began to explore some new and more in-depth education opportunities. From there, it felt like the Holy Spirit said "watch this!"*

*When first approached with this opportunity, I was overwhelmed and humbled at the mere thought. But, it didn't take long for my wheels to start turning and creativity to spark. When I go back to what brought me to work at the church in the beginning, it was to help with foundation building. That is still what I'll be doing, just in a different way. I'm very excited to look at the training of leaders, the expansion of mission and justice work, and strengthening our (Westminster's)*



*foundation through the lens of adult discipleship. We, the adults, need to be sure in who we are and what we believe so that we can help set the stage for and train up the next generation of disciples. That is what excites me about this opportunity.*

**Name a Bible verse or character that is particularly meaningful to you and why:**

*Matthew 6:33-34 But seek first God's kingdom and righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own.*

*Since I was a little girl hearing my mother sing the song Seek Ye First, I have leaned heavily on this scripture from Matthew 6 teaching us not to worry but to rely on God. This is a lesson I've had to learn over and over again many times in my life. I've viewed it differently through the different phases of my life. But knowing that God is a constant and having faith that God's plan is good has helped keep my faith strong.*

**What is your prayer for discipleship at Westminster Presbyterian Church?**

*I'm excited about the growth and momentum that has been present at Westminster for the past few years. My prayer for Westminster is that we continue to grow, not only in numbers, but also in faith and in action. We have such a special family environment here and my hope is that we can strengthen our inclusive community both inside the church and out in the community by learning more and going out and doing what God calls us to do!*

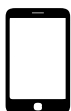
