READ GOOD BOOKS IN 2026!

Join Pastor Daniel in reading books covering a variety of topics, authors, and genres. The choices are designed to stimulate the heart and mind and to be a catalyst for growth in discipleship. Read in preparation for the group discussion at 4:00 p.m. on the 4th Sunday of every other month.

TODAY at 4pm we'll discuss Chinua Achebe's *Things Fall Apart*. With more than twenty million copies sold and translated into fifty-seven languages, *Things Fall Apart* provides one of the most illuminating and permanent monuments to African experience. The story follows the tragic life of a high-performing but deeply flawed African native inhabiting an exalted place within his traditional Umuofia society which is under threat from European imperialists. Themes covered are: Colonialism and Cultural Change, Masculinity and Identity, and Tradition vs. Change. (Books are \$10 and available online or in the Narthex.)

FROM THE SESSION

Trusting the Spirit’s leading and grateful for the ministry God is doing among us, the Session has approved a faith budget of **\$1,035,805 for 2026**. This budget reflects our shared commitment to worship, care, formation, mission, and outreach in Christ’s name.

Based on anticipated giving, other income, and our 2025 actual receipts, we are currently projecting a **budget shortfall of \$143,609**. That is larger than what we typically face, yet Session approved this budget because we believe deeply in the mission and ministry it supports. While designated funds—essentially our church’s savings—could cover the gap if needed, our hope is not to rely on those funds.

Instead, we want to extend a **simple and prayerful invitation** to our congregation.

- If you have already pledged, we invite you to prayerfully consider whether you might be able to take a small step up—an increase that reflects both your capacity and your care for this church.
- If you have not pledged before, we invite you to consider a pledge not as an obligation, but as a spiritual practice—a way of saying, *“This is my church, and I share responsibility for its life and witness.”*

An additional **\$50–\$60 per month from each family** would bridge the gap and bring us into alignment with our commitments to ministry and mission.

If most of your giving is currently designated for a specific ministry, we also invite you to consider whether a portion of that generosity might support the operating ministry that sustains everything else we do together.

If you feel led to respond to this invitation, you may do so **using the QR code** or an Estimate of Giving Card found in the narthex.

BUILD A LEGACY OF DISCIPLESHIP THROUGH THE WESTMINSTER ENDOWMENT

Years ago, faithful disciples started the Westminster Endowment. Thanks to generous giving and wise investments with The Presbyterian Foundation, the Endowment has grown and is a source of support for Westminster mission and ministry. A gift to the Endowment today is a gift that keeps on giving, year after year.

Here's how it works: Every year, 3% of the General-Purpose Endowment goes to support the annual church budget. That means a legacy gift of \$100 to that fund will provide \$3 to the annual church operating budget in perpetuity. A legacy gift of \$10,000 will provide \$300. A gift of \$100,000 will provide \$3,000. Every year. It is a way you can continue to support the mission and ministry of the church forever.

A gift to the General-Purpose Fund is a great way to support ministry long into the future, but it is not the only way. 



Because this Welsh melody usually sets evening texts, the author was asked to create one for use in daytime. His recasting of the Aaronic blessing in Numbers 6:22-27 imagines that passage as a benediction that might be spoken by God at the conclusion of a worship service.
