YOU'RE INVITED! ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL

- **The Anchor Class:** This class emphasizes fellowship, good discussion, and growth. Studying the book of ACTS. Class is led by David Jump and meets in Room 15 of the Education Building.
- **The Cary Grayson Class:** This class is facilitated by a team of leaders that engage in a study and reflection of the Bible. Studying 1&2 Kings. Class meets in Room 4 of Covenant Hall.
- **The LIFE Class** We’re using the Lenten Devotional guide to work through the 7 Last Words of Jesus from the Cross. Pastor Priscilla and Lindy Coleman, leaders.

And before the Nazis banned him from publishing, German theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer published this book on the Psalms. What comfort is found in the Psalter? What praise, and what challenge? What threat? Discover the richness this book of Scripture held for Bonhoeffer, and learn to pray psalms along with Christ. First published in 1940, this classic reveals how the Psalms are essential to the life of the believer and offers Bonhoeffer's reflections on psalms of thanksgiving, suffering, guilt, praise, and lament." EASTER MISSION BREAKFAST

Join us on Easter morning at 10:00 in Covenant Hall for a delicious pancake breakfast. It is good FOOD, good FELLOWSHIP, and generous FUNDING for our Mexico mission partnership. In Mexico, we partner with Todd Luke and a group of Presbyterian leaders who have been serving their communities for more than 20 years by building water cisterns which address the dire need for usable water in that part of the Yucatan. A WPC team of adults went in February, and a team of youth and adults is going in June/July. A donation bucket will be out, and we encourage your support there or online on the church website (choose 2026 Mission Trips) \$3600 will fund a whole water cistern. \$260 will buy a pile of sand or rocks- a fitting gift since that's what our teams spend the week shoveling.

Years ago, faithful disciples started the Westminster Endowment. Thanks to generous giving and wise investments with The Presbyterian Foundation, the Endowment has grown and is a source of support for Westminster mission and ministry. Here's how it works: Every year, 3% of the General-Purpose Endowment goes to support the annual church budget.
