## **NEWS FROM THE FINANCE COMMITTEE**

In January, the Session approved a budget of \$1,035,805 for 2026, reflecting our shared commitment to worship, care, formation, mission, and outreach in Christ's name. At the time of the budget's approval, we projected a budget shortfall of \$143,609, based on anticipated giving, other income and our 2025 actual receipts. That is larger than what we typically face, yet Session approved this budget because we believe deeply in the mission and ministry it supports. When we shared this budget at our congregational meeting in February, we extended a prayerful invitation for pledges to help reduce the budget shortfall. While the church has savings to cover the gap if needed, our hope is not to rely on those funds. Through the congregation's faithful and generous response to this invitation, the projected budget shortfall was reduced by more than \$20,000 and now stands at approximately \$123,000. Our church savings are adequate to cover the gap for 2026. The Session is grateful for the congregation's commitment to the mission and ministry of the church. Thank you for your faithful giving.

- Economic re-energizing of disinvested North Charleston neighborhoods


### **MOTHER’S DAY OFFERING**





In the course of many revisions, the original eucharistic emphasis of this text has shifted to a hymn of thanksgiving for a wide range of human experience, with a Christological summation. It is set here to the tune that is customary in North America, though not elsewhere.

Two great truths inform this text: first, that the testimony of experience is powerful and persuasive; and second, that no one should venture to minister on one's own strength rather than God's. The tune reflects a 19th-century practice of adapting piano pieces as hymn tunes.

Because this Welsh melody usually sets evening texts, the author was asked to create one for use in daytime. His recasting of the Aaronic blessing in Numbers 6:22-27 imagines that passage as a benediction that might be spoken by God at the conclusion of a worship service.
