ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL OPPORTUNITIES THIS FALL AT WESTMINSTER:

- **The Anchor Class:** This class emphasizes fellowship, good discussion, and growth. Studying Psalm 23. This class will begin meeting on September 6th in Room 4.
- **The Cary Grayson Class:** This class meets in the Parlor and is engaged in a study and reflection of the Bible. Studying 2 Chronicles.
- **The LIFE Class:** This class meets in the Library and is full of deep questions and deep answers. Currently using a study titled The Distorted Images of God.
- **The Come As You Are Class:** This class is designed to meet adults wherever they are in their journey with the Bible. If you're new, been studying for years, or anywhere in between, just come as you are. The class will read and discuss Jesus' parables. Participants don't need to prepare ahead. This class meets in Room 15 of the Education Building.

WHAT IF YOU COULD STUDY THE BIBLE LIKE A LITERATURE COURSE? Join Natasha Akery in reading the book of Jonah as a satirical text that critiques exclusionary grace. Participants will learn the basics of literary inquiry and how this approach to the Bible can expand theological depth and our appreciation of the world's most beautiful work of literature. 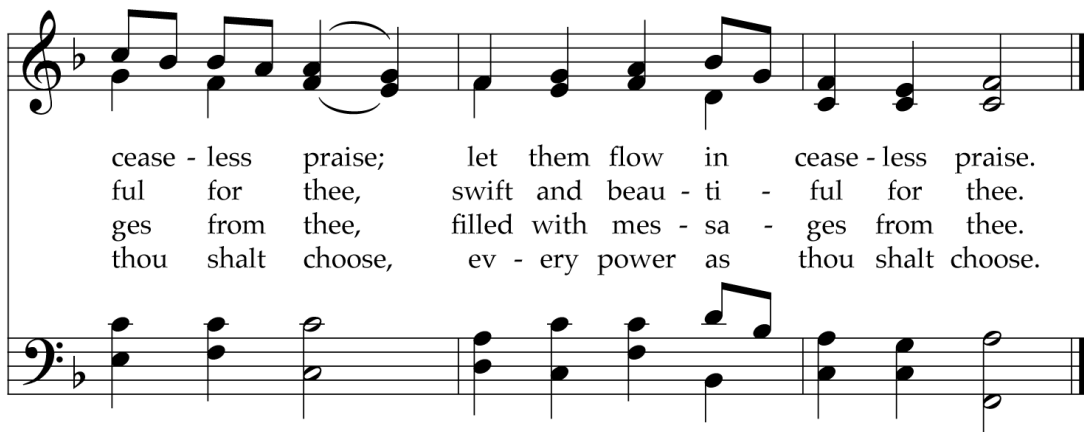

This hymn of consecration radiates from the repeated word "take," resulting in a remarkably full survey of a person's attributes and possessions and giving weight to the "all" at the end. The composer of the tune was influential in the renewal of Reformed hymnody in French.
