ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL OPPORTUNITIES THIS FALL AT WESTMINSTER:

- **The Anchor Class:** This class emphasizes fellowship, good discussion, and growth. Studying Psalm 23. This class meets in Room 4.
- **The Cary Grayson Class:** This class meets in the Parlor and is engaged in a study and reflection of the Bible. Studying 2 Chronicles.
- **The LIFE Class:** This class meets in the Library and is full of deep questions and deep answers. Currently using a study titled The Distorted Images of God.
- **The Come As You Are Class:** This class is designed to meet adults wherever they are in their journey with the Bible. If you're new, been studying for years, or anywhere in between, just come as you are. The class will read and discuss Jesus' parables. Participants don't need to prepare ahead.
