ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL OPPORTUNITIES THIS FALL AT WESTMINSTER:

- **The Anchor Class:** This class emphasizes fellowship, good discussion, and growth. Studying Psalm 23. This class meets in Room 4.
- **The Cary Grayson Class:** This class meets in the Parlor and is engaged in a study and reflection of the Bible. Studying 2 Chronicles.
- **The LIFE Class:** This class meets in the Library and is full of deep questions and deep answers. Currently using a study titled *The Distorted Images of God*.
- **The Come As You Are Class:** This class is designed to meet adults wherever they are in their journey with the Bible. GLOBAL MISSION TRIP OPPORTUNITY IN 2027!

In **Mexico**, we're returning to share in the CISTERN MINISTRY of Todd Luke in the Yucatan. Todd works with local families in building rainwater cisterns so families can have a year-round supply of safe water. The church identifies the needs and works alongside families and mission teams to construct needed cisterns. There are two opportunities in 2027:

- o a team of adults February 15-20.
- o a team of High Schoolers June 28-July 3.

The total cost of each trip is about \$2100, and the cost will be divided in thirds between participant contribution, the church's Global Mission Fund, and group fundraising. These teams are intentionally small- no more than 8 people per team. Save your spot on the February team with a conversation with Pastor Daniel and a \$200 deposit payable to WPC by October 31.

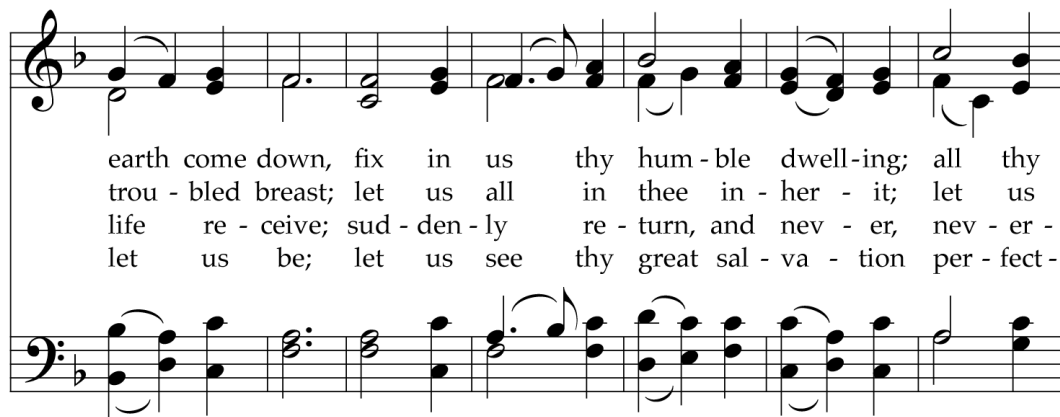
QUARTERS EVERY QUARTER!

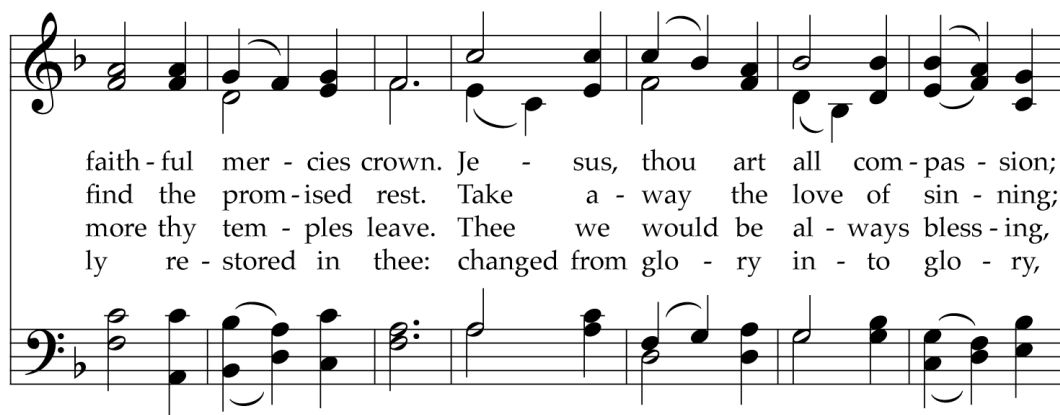

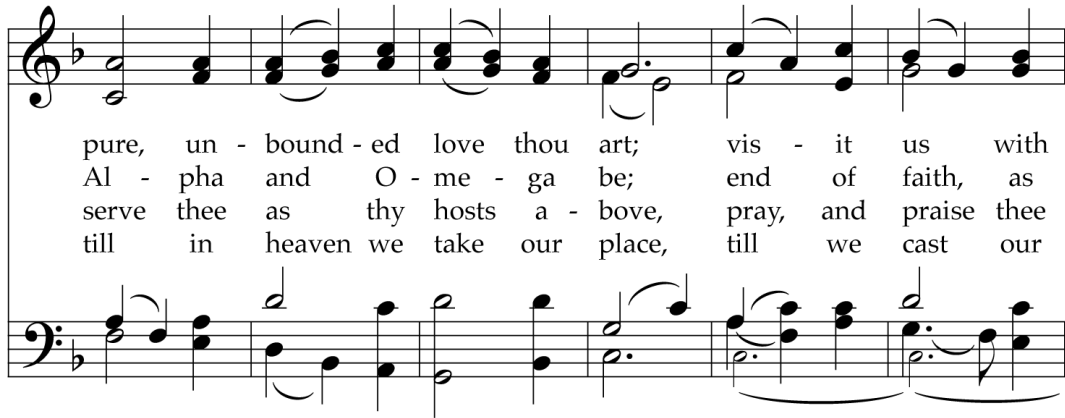
